### ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

### BETWEEN

### Palm Beach State College

#### AND

### **Herzing University**

This agreement establishes a cooperative relationship between **Palm Beach State College** (the College) and **Herzing University** (the University) for the purpose of facilitating and promoting transfer of students' credit between the institutions.

It is mutually agreed upon:

### Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. Under the provisions of this agreement, the University agrees to accept unfettered transfer of associate degree credits from the College into the University's bachelor's degree program.
- B. Palm Beach State graduates accepted into the Herzing University Bachelor of Science in Accounting (BSA) program must fulfill the graduation requirements of the University.

#### **Transfer of Credits**

- A. Herzing University will accept 64 semester credit hours from Palm Beach State College, Associate of Applied Science (AAS) or Associate of Science in Accounting Technology (AS) to apply to Bachelor of Science in Accounting (BSA). 59 semester credit hours remain to complete the receiving program and award.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the Program Articulation Table included in this Articulation Agreement.

### **Terms of Agreement**

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with Florida statutes, College and University policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. Program curriculum and requirements listed in the Program Articulation Table are subject to may change.
- C. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 1/4/12 and shall remain in effect until 1/4/16 unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- D. The College agrees to facilitate communication between its graduates and upcoming graduates with representatives of the University through access to students on campus, posting and distribution of the University's promotional literature, and access to student and graduate listings as mutual agreed between the institutions.
